ORDER OF BUSINESS

Monday, February 13, 1950

- Art. 1—To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2—To choose all necessary Officers—The following to be voted for on the Official Ballot, viz:—Town Clerk, for term of one year, one Selectman for a term of three years, one member of the School Committee for a term of three years, one Assessor for a term of three years, Auditor, Tree Warden, four Constables for a term of one year, and three members of the Board of Finance Committee for a term of three years, one member of the Board of Finance for one year, and to appoint a committee of three to bring in a list of all minor Town officers.
- Art. 3—To receive and act upon the report of the Selectmen.
- Art. 4—To receive and act upon the report of the School Committee.
- Art. 5—To raise and appropriate \$51,871.00 for the Schools.
- Art. 6—To raise and appropriate \$12,000.00 for Public Welfare.
- Art. 7—To raise and appropriate \$800.00 for Bridges
- Art. 8—To raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 for Snow Roads
- Art. 9—To raise and appropriate \$400.00 for Miscellaneous.
- Art. 10—To raise and appropriate \$2,397.00 for Street Lights.
- Art. 11—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$140.00 for Surety Bonds for the Treasurer, Tax Collector, and Town Clerk.
- Art. 12—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$85.00 for Inspection of Slaughtering.
- Art. 13—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$400.00 for the use of the Tree Warden.
- Art. 14—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Hinsdale Free Public Library plus the Dog Tax.
- Art. 15—To accept a List of Jurors as presented by the Selectmen.

- Art. 16—To see if the Town will vote to give the Collector of Taxes the same power Town Treasurers have by law when appointed Collector of Taxes.
- Art. 17—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for the observance of Memorial Day, and name the Committee to receive the same.
- Art. 18—To determine the salary of the Sealer of Weights and Measures and to raise and appropriate a sum of \$75.00 for the same.
- Art. 19—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of \$350.00 for Workingmen's Compensation.
- Art. 20—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning January 1, 1950, and to issue a note or notes therefor, payable within one year, and to renew any note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Section 17, Chapter 44, General Laws.
- Art. 21—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$100.00 for Police Protection.
- Art. 22—To see if the Town will vote to constitute the Board of Selectmen, the Board of Welfare for the year of 1951.
- Art. 23—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$14,000.00 for Aid to Dependent Children.
- Art. 24—To see if the Town will vote to have the cash in the Treasury transferred to help defray the expenses of the ensuing year.
- Art. 25—To see if the Town will vote to co-operate with the State Department of Public Works, Division of Highways, relative to the repair of Town Highways under Chapter 81, Acts of 1919, and to raise and appropriate \$2,775.00 for the same.
- Art. 26—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to pay interest on notes for the ensuing year.
- Art. 27—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of \$150.00 for Forest Fires.

- Art. 28—To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new town truck at a cost of \$8,500.00 for both summer and winter use. The truck will be paid for by appropriating \$1,300.00 from the road machinery fund. The additional \$7,200.00 needed will be subscribed by the issuing of a series of five Town of Hinsdale notes, each one of the notes will fall due, annually, for a period of five years, or \$1,440.00 will be paid each year, over the five year period.
- Art. 29—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for Road Machinery Account.
- Art. 30—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$1,000.00 for Reserve Fund.
- Art. 31—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$650.00 for maintenance of the Fire Department.
- Art. 32—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of \$700.00 for Soldiers' Relief.
- Art. 33—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 for the Old Age Assistance, General Laws, Chapter 118A, inserted by the Acts of 1930, Chapter 402.
- Art. 34—To see if the Town will vote to fix the compensation of \$100.00 for the Cattle Inspector, and raise and appropriate the same.
- Art. 35—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of \$300.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemetery.
- Art. 36—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 to compensate the Board of Assessors for their Services.
- Art. 37—To see if the Town will vote to pay the Tax Collector one and one half per cent. of the tax levy and \$150.00 for expenses.
- Art. 38—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of \$100.00 to maintain the Public Dump.
- Art. 39—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the purpose of continuing a Dental Clinic for school children.
- Art. 40—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to apply on notes on Kittridge School.

- Art. 41—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the expenses of Assessors.
- Art. 42—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$940.00 to subsidize hot noon lunches for the School children.
- Art. 43—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the salaries of registrars and their supplies.
- Art. 44—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for the printing of town reports and ballots.
- Art. 45—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Insurance Premiums.
- Art. 46—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$62.50 for town use of water.
- Art. 47—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 for Town Hall Maintenance.
- Art. 48—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Chapter 90 maintenance.
- Art. 49—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for the administration of all phases of welfare.
- Art. 50—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for maintenance of the road at Plunkett Lake that serves the cottages at the Lake.
- Art. 51—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$415.00 for Gypsy Moth Control.
- Art. 52—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Recreation.
- Art. 53—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the search of tax titles.
- Art. 54—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 as a salary for the Chief of the Fire Department.
- Art. 55—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of maintenance of baseball field.
- Art. 56—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,450.00 to pay the salaries of town officers, the tax collector (who is paid on a percentage basis) and election officers.

- Art. 57—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for highway work under Chapter 90 on Windsor Road. This proposal is conditional, depending on the County to subscribe \$1,000.00 and the State \$2,000.00 towards the project. The work will start at the intersection of Windsor Road and Maple Street and continue as far north as the available money will allow.
- Art. 58—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to combat Dutch Elm disease.
- Art. 59—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to spray the dump and river banks as a measure of preventing polio.
- Art. 60—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$389.52 for the Berkshire County Retirement System.
- Art. 61—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purchase of snow fence.
- Art. 62—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for a concrete floor in the town Garage.
- Art. 63—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell the small tractor and its snow plow.
- Art. 64—To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into an agreement with a series of other towns in establishing a Welfare District.
- Art. 65—To see if the Town will vote to authorize a wire inspector for the town to conform with the new state regulations, and appropriate an amount of money for same.
- Art. 66—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00; to be used by the Honor Roll Committee appointed at the annual town meeting in 1949 to repair granite soldier's monument at the Library and to purchase and install thereon a bronze plaque bearing names of Hinsdale persons who served in World War II.
- Art. 67—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 under Chapter 90 to be spent on Tulley Mountain Road. This money will be spent with the understanding that the County will contribute \$1,000.00 and the State \$2,000.00.
- Art. 68—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$275.00 for the installation of four street lights on Windsor Road from the home of Otis Flint to the Alderman home on the same road. This cost would pay for the current for the remainder of 1950, 1951 and 1952.
- Art. 69—To do and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING COMMITTEE

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens of Hinsdale:

Herewith is submitted my fifth annual report as Superintendent of your school.

We have in some ways a right to be proud of our school. It is with pleasure that we show our facilities to visitors. The classrooms and corridor were painted in pastel colors last summer and the rooms are light and attractive. Our audio-visual equipment is excellent, textbooks and supplies are fairly well taken care of. Our lunchroom facilities and program are excellent. Our teachers are fine and experienced but—There are too many pupils per teacher. As a matter of fact our pupil teacher ratio is the highest of the Massachusetts towns of our class of under 5000 population. This condition is one which can continue with the general public unaware of the irreparable loss to the average pupil. The children are in school, and in the minds of most parents it is then up to the teacher or school officials. It is the wish of all of us that each child should be treated as an individual and his development nurtured to the highest degree of achievement that he may become a happy, well-adjusted individual equipped to make the most of his talents and become a good citizen. The school cannot do this alone, but could do a far better job if there were fewer pupils per teacher. 35 and 42 pupils in some of the rooms should be reduced to about 25. As I see the picture for next year it is going to be worse, and three years hence it will be practically impossible.

Realizing that with a \$65 tax rate two thirds of the voters would not think that an addition to the school would be possible, we have waited. It is not because of the proposed addition that the tax rate is \$65. It is because the tax rate is \$65 that the addition is delayed.

The above table is for last year but is the latest table available. The towns of Group IV are those of under 5,000 population. This is a good figure to make comparisons with. The other figure is the average of the entire state. Our per pupil cost was 14th from the bottom of a list of 350 cities and towns.

In spite of the necessity of increasing many of the items in the budget by small amounts the total budget is a little over a thousand dollars less than last year. This is accounted for by not having an item like the Univent in this year's

budget and a lesser amount for the high school tuition item. Your School Committee studied each item carefully and has presented a total budget of \$51,871.00 for 1950. The estimated net cost to the Town of Hinsdale for the support of schools for the year 1950 is about three thousand dollars less than the net cost for 1949.

The Iowa Every-Pupil Tests of basic skills were administered to grades 5, 6, 7, and 8. These tests are divided into parts testing reading skills, work-study skills, language skills, and arithmetic skills. Upon the completion of the scoring of these tests each pupil made a graph of his scores and was able to compare his rating with the median of others of his grade level. Thus he was able to recognize his strengths and weaknesses and saw on what phases he should work harder. The class averages show grades 5 and 6 above the median—grade 7 just on the median and grade 8 below the median. There may be some connection between the lower test scores and the crowded rooms.

During the past summer vacation each of the regular classrooms was painted. The white ceilings and border with white down to the window sill on the window side added much to the light in the room. Pastel shades of blue, green, yellow, rose, and peach were used in several combinations according to the exposure of the room. The corridor walls were painted brown and light green with a white ceiling. A rubber runner was put on the corridor floor and rubber treads on the stairs.

A cabinet was built along the side of the kitchen, a new asphalt tile floor was laid in the kitchen. A new electric hot water heater was purchased using funds from the lunch program.

Frank Bauman, our janitor, did some of the painting, built the cabinet and helped install the hot water heater.

After many years service in the very important position of teacher of Grade 1, Mrs. Isabelle Butler resigned to give full time to her home work and the early training of one pre-school daughter. We appreciate the fine type of teacher that she was and are pleased that she is so happy with her new home and family.

We were fortunate in filling this vacancy by the appointment of a well trained and experienced teacher, Mrs. Jean Sharland.

As Mr. Noyes, last year's music supervisor, chose to give his full time to the Lee Union, we then had a vacancy in the position of music supervisor. We have been pleased with the work of our new music supervisor, Mr. John Roberts.

REPORT OF THE ART SUPERVISOR

Dear Mr. Suitor:

Not only this school year of 1949 but for years past I have tried to make the pupils understand that everyone would profit by a knowledge of art, regardless of whether he uses it to earn his bread and butter or for the enrichment of living through greater enjoyment of man's creations or those of the "Master Creator". We are surrounded at all times by art and its influences and we should try to reap all the benefits it affords and enjoy it to the fullest. This is not done by piling layer upon layer of dull facts upon a child's mind, thus sealing every crevice through which creative ideas emanate. It is living with and understanding its full implications so that instinctively it becomes a part of the child.

This year the results were certainly varied, interesting and most acceptable. Each lesson, preceded by a discussion period refreshed the minds, started imaginations working, thus relaxing tension and removing previous fear or indecision. Choices were then freely made; the pupils anxiously "set to work". All people are color-conscious and in order to have a wealth of information as background much stress was put upon the study of color by means of the rainbow and color wheel followed by the applied lesson in "Still Life".

Because the Berkshires are blessed with so many cultural undertakings and interesting landmarks, we had interesting lessons on Tanglewood, the Museum, Indian trails, etc.

The study of some of the Old Masters and their masterpieces produced an unusual reaction. After such a study, the children were pleasantly surprised to find that they were really a part of such a way of life.

In the field of crafts, they designed and constructed furnishings for houses and dioramas of other kinds and other lands.

The spatter work technique was new to the pupils in grades six through eight and was well received.

Sectional maps of Berkshire County, the counties in Massachusetts and the forty-eight states of the Union, done with pieces of colored construction paper were extremely well executed and most educational as well.

Because theory is necessary in order to get the greatest enjoyment from living, it can be so presented and disguised that the pupil does not realize that he is really learning the so-called A-B-C's of art education.

These are but a few of the subjects in the art program. Surely the fine results of the past year could not have been achieved had not the students and teachers entered into the spirit of the work so wholeheartedly and had not the Superintendent, School Board and citizens of Hinsdale provided us so generously with working materials, for which we are most grateful.

REPORT OF THE MUSIC SUPERVISOR

Dear Mr. Sutor:

The use of the singing voice as the basic means toward a fuller understanding and love of music is generally recognized. It has been my endeavor to instill a desire to sing in all of the children. Songs with greatest appeal and value were chosen for the various age levels.

Rhythm band instruments have been employed in the first and second grades as aids in learning to master rhythm fundamentals and also to awaken musical interest. Many rote songs, an elementary vocabulary of music notation, dancing, and voice placement have been included.

Plastic song flutes have been purchased by the students in the fourth grade. Their use is twofold; first as an excellent aid in reading music and second to discover those students possessing talent and a will to practice.

Much has been accomplished through the use of Sol Fa syllables from the second grade through the eighth toward gaining familiarity with the score.

Good two and three part singing has been achieved in the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades.

I wish to thank the teachers for their cooperation in this work.
