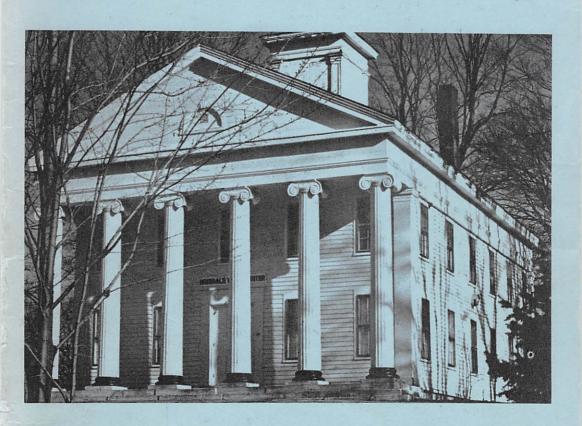

Selectmen's Report

Once again, it has been another busy year for the Town of Hinsdale. The following is a brief summary.

- 1. The Department of Environmental Management has completed repairs to the Plunkett Lake dam and gate.
- 2. The DPW completed reconstruction of Frank Schnopp Road and also the portion of Longview Avenue and Plunkett Road to the transfer station. This year, other priorities will be worked on.
- 3. The water meters are finally completed. Hopefully, a fair formula can be worked out and in operation by late this year or early next year.
- 4. The water filtration plant construction at Belmont Resevoir is well under way, and will hopefully be completed in the latter part of this year.
- 5. The Town again has received yet another EOCD grant. This will be used for Americans with Disabilities Act work at Kittredge School, water main replacement on South Street (Route 8), rehabilitation work on the Youth Center Building, and housing rehabilitation loans for incomeeligible residents of Hinsdale and Peru. Hopefully we will apply and win a grant for water main replacement on Lower Main Street this year.
- 6. The Highway Department seems to be in good shape since acquiring the new International truck, plus a pick-up truck acquired through Ray Bolduc from the state Surplus program. Thanks go to Ray for the many items he has brought into the Town at no cost.
- 7. We would also like at this time to thank Chris Regan, our administrative assistant, for a fine job throughout the year, for the job of Selectman has become more than a part time job. Assistance will always be sorely needed in the future.
- 8. Also, thanks go out to all elected and appointed officials and volunteers, who have served the Town to their utmost. Thanks to all for working so well together.

ARTICLE 1: A moderator needed to be nominated from the floor resulting from the resignation of elected town moderator, Dennis Burden. A motion was made and seconded to nominate Richard Marran for this meeting. The vote was unanimous.

ARTICLE 2: Voted to amend Article 4 of the May 18, 1994 Annual Town Meeting to reduce the appropriation for the FY95 Operating Costs of the Central Berkshire Regional School District from \$1,079,401.00 to \$1,076,836.00.

ARTICLE 3: Voted to transfer from Certified Free Cash and appropriate the sum of \$50.95 to pay an FY94 WMECO bill for the Hinsdale Athletic Field.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 4: Amended to Read: To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Certified Free Cash and appropriate the sum of \$1,292.04 for tax and interest due for diesel fuel used in motor vehicles (\$245.74 tax/\$74.09 interest for FY92, \$734.62 tax/\$106.44 interest for FY93, and \$121.37 tax/\$9.78 interest for FY94) as itemized by the Massachusetts Department of Revenue on September 30, 1994, plus an additional \$25.00 to cover any additional interest accrued since September 30, 1994.

VOTE ON AMENDMENT: PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

After some discussion, the article was further amended to read: To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Certified Free Cash and appropriate the sum of \$1,292.04 for tax and interest due for diesel fuel used in motor vehicles (\$245.74 tax/\$74.09 interest for FY92, \$734.62 tax/\$106.44 interest for FY93, and \$121.37 tax/\$9.78 interest for FY94) as itemized by the Massachusetts Department of Revenue on September 30, 1994, plus an additional \$25.00 to cover any additional interest accrued since September 30, 1994, which will increase the total sum of \$1,292.04 to \$1,317.04.

ARTICLE 5: Voted to transfer from Certified Free Cash and appropriate the sum of \$150.72 to pay an FY94 L.P. Adams bill for oil delivered to the Youth Center building.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 6: Voted to transfer from Certified Free Cash and appropriate the sum of \$1,209.80 to pay an FY94 Berkshire Clean-Way Inc. bill for solid waste transportation and disposal.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 7: Voted to transfer from Certified Free Cash into Water Rents Reserved \$3,687.55, this being the sum received as interest on the FY94 Water Rehab Loan and put into the General Fund by DOR regulations.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 8: Voted to transfer from Certified Free Cash and appropriate the sum of \$75.70 to pay an FY94 highway department bill from the Hinsdale Service Center for diesel fuel.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARICLE 9: Voted to transfer from Certified Free Cash and appropriate the sum of \$140.00 for FY94 Appeals Board expenses.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 10: Voted to amend Article 26 of the May 18, 1994 Annual Town Meeting, increasing the sum appropriated from "Water Rents" from \$17,869.00 to \$17,970.59 for interest on the bond anticipation note for the water rehabilitation project, which payment was due on July 15, 1994 (FY95).

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 11: Voted to appropriate from Water Rents Reserved the sum of \$38.57 to pay an FY94 WMECO bill for the water chlorinator, and the sum of \$738.75 to pay an FY94 Berkshire Enviro-Labs bill for water testing.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 12: Voted to appropriate from available fund Water Rents Reserved the sum of \$4,654.08 to reimburse the short-term interest account for interest paid on the \$570,871.00 Water Rehabilitation Bond Anticipation Note.

PASSED UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 13: Voted to authorize the Town Treasurer to borrow the necessary funds, up to \$100,000, for the purpose of building a chemical storage facility, the amount expended to be reimbursed by the MA Highway Department through Salt Shed Agreement #7007 and in accordance with the Chapter 15 of the Acts of 1988 and Chapter 33 of the Acts of 1991 Transportation Bond Issues.

ARTICLE 14: Voted to appropriate the sum of \$127,824.00 from available funds "1994 Transportation Bond Issue" for capital improvements on Hinsdale Town Roads in accordance with Chapter 85 of the Acts of 1994.

ARTICLE 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$31,755.00 for Vocational Education Tuition and Transportation.

ARTICLE 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$85,000.00 for Waste Disposal Operating Expenses.

ARTICLE 9: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from available funds "Sewer Receipts Reserved For Appropriation" for payment of principal and interest on Fiscal Year 1996 sewer debt obligations the sum of \$16,693.00.

ARTICLE 10: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$4,000.00 for Sewer Maintenance from available funds "Sewer Receipts Reserved for Appropriation."

ARTICLE 11: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$30,000.00 for the Hinsdale Sewer Committee Operating Expenses from available funds "Sewer Receipts Reserved for Appropriation", of which amount \$1,000.00 shall be the salary of the Sewer Administrator.

ARTICLE 12: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$55,000.00 for Water Department Expenses from available funds "Water Rents", of which amount \$52,900.00 shall be for Water Department Operating Expense, \$1,000.00 shall be for the Water Department Administrator salary and \$1,100.00 to be for Water Department Administration Expenses.

ARTICLE 13: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,500.00 for a new police cruiser.

ARTICLE 14: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$6,725.00 for interest and principal on the Fire House Loan.

Administrative Assistant

With the assistance of the Berkshire Housing Development Corporation, we were very fortunate to have our 1994 grant application approved for \$522,727 from the Executive Office of Communities and Development's Community Development Block Grant Program and \$53,190 from the HOME Program. With this award, we will be able to fund ADA (handicapped accessibility) work at Kittredge School, water pipe replacement on South Street, rehabilitation of the Youth Center building, and housing rehabilitation for income eligible residents of Hinsdale and Peru! Berkshire Housing will be administering the grant for us again this year.

A major effort was begun this past year, and will continue, to inform and urge all town residents to fully participate in the Town's recycling effort. Besides the obvious environmental benefits of recycling, there are financial benefits, as well. Each ton of waste which is recycled, rather than incinerated, saves the town between \$20 and \$30. Also, the state has set a deadline of July of 1996 by which time all towns or waste districts must be recycling at least 20% of their waste to avoid paying a tipping fee at the Materials Recycling Facility in Springfield. Hinsdale is currently recycling at only about 14%, compared to the statewide average of 28%. **Reducing** waste volume by composting appropriate food and yard waste and purchasing items with recyclable or minimal packaging, **re-using** containers when possible, and **recycling** as much as possible will help bring this percentage up. If you need information about what is or is not recyclable, please contact me at 655-2245.

I continued this year to serve as the Selectmen's representative to the Seven Town Advisory Council, and served on the Central Berkshire Regional School District Superintendent Search Committee, as well. I assisted Meredith Read, Water and Sewer Administrator, in re-creating a computer program for water and sewer billing, attended Small Town Administrators of MA meetings to keep informed on current issues, and continue to publish "Hinsdale News" on a monthly basis.

I have enjoyed this past year, and look forward to 1995/96.

Berkshire Visiting Nurse Association

Once again, we at the Berkshire VNA have been pleased to perform home health and Board of Health services for residents of the Town of Hinsdale. The field of home care is a growing field, primarily because it is patient-focused and considerably less costly than institutional care. In the future, we anticipate a growing need for home health services.

The Berkshire VNA, under the guidance of medical orders from physicians, provides a variety of services for all medically eligible residents regardless of ability to pay. These services include professional community health nursing, home health aide/personal assistants, a variety of rehabilitative therapies, including physical and occupational therapy, medical social services, mental health clinical services, infusion therapy and maternal child health and family health care.

In addition, the Berkshire VNA has been a long-established quality provider of public health services of towns wishing to receive Board of Health services to assist in the tracking and control of communicable diseases. This year, in particular, immunizations have gained increasing attention. The Berkshire VNA administered approximately 3,000 flu immunizations in the past year throughout Berkshire County, as well as pneumovax (pneumonia vaccine) and many of the vaccines utilized for childhood protection. Berkshire VNA has been active in its role in assisting towns to protect town workers against such newly resurfaced medical problems, as tuberculosis and rabies. Our extremely experienced Board of Health Coordinator, Cora Cooney, R.N., has an indepth familiarity with the tracking and management of potential public health hazards, such as giardia, salmonellosis, and other serious communicable diseases. In addition, the serious concern of Cora Cooney and other professional health public health staff is for the welfare of the individual and his family. Therefore, all efforts are focused on assuring full recovery and re-entry into normal, productive lifestyles for those who may have contracted serious infection and illness.

Your Board of Health Services also include screening for blood pressure problems and other potential medical problems.

We at the Berkshire VNA wish to thank members of the Board of Health of Hinsdale for creating an environment for communication and positive working relationships.

Hinsdale Board of Health

In addition to addressing concerns and complaints that arise in the course of the year, our Board of Health is also studying current and long term issues that affect the health and well-being of our town's residents. There are two major issues we began assessing last year and will continue to do so this year. (1) Title-V, and (2) public smoking and control of tobacco products.

The new Title-V/310 Code of Massachusetts Regulations (CMR) 15.00, which became effective March 31, 1995, is imposing stricter regulations on septic systems. We are in the process of reviewing the potential impacts of this regulation on our town, in particular, those impacts concerning residents that live next to or in close proximity to lakes. We are also assessing the regulation's relationship with our Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC). One step we are considering is reactivating Phase-III development of the town's sewer service. If you recall, Phase-III was meant to provide sewer service to the residents around Ashmere Lake and Plunkett reservoir.

Control of the sale and use of tobacco products is the second issue we're facing. State laws currently regulate smoking in public areas, and local governments are taking it one step further by adopting stricter bylaws. Neighboring towns that have adopted new smoking bylaws are encouraging other towns, including Hinsdale, to do the same. We have reviewed bylaws adopted by local communities (e.g. Tri-Towns BOH-Lee, Lenox, Stockbridge) as a model for our own, and we intend to promulgate our proposed bylaws and seek town approval sometime in 1995.

One issue that continues to receive our attention is that of Rabies. Rabies is still on the increase and has reached our Town. In Hinsdale, several reports were made this year regarding wild and domestic animals inflicted with the mid-Atlantic strain of Rabies. With the help of Dr. Beebe and his staff, we were successful in raising our resident's awareness through Rabies clinics conducted the last two years. We continue to stress the importance of protecting your pets with vaccines (it is now a state law to vaccinate cats as well as dogs). We also ask that everyone maintain awareness of potentially inflicted animals, and to report your suspicions to the animal Control Officer, Hinsdale Police, or to the BOH.

In conclusion I would like to state that this year has been transitional for the three-year old Board of Health. During many of our meetings we discussed the need to establish local operating procedures and policies and how they would interact with the State. During our first years we were barraged with problems and issues needing immediate attention. First hand exposure to these issues has contributed to building a foundation of understanding and experience needed to help us improve and establish an effective agency for the Town. From this we have begun to set the framework in place to establish operating policies, and to automate our record keeping. This will enable future members serving the BOH to focus on problems at hand and spend less time performing administrative functions.

Council on Aging

The Hinsdale site served 6,200 meals to seniors over 60 years old in 1994.

On the first Wednesday of each month, a blood pressure screening is held at 10: 30 a.m. This service is open to all seniors in town.

Every other Wednesday, we show movies and serve punch and popcorn. Movies are historical, funny, great National Parks... and they are enjoyed by all.

Twice a month, we have readings, poems, limericks or short stories.

Once a month we serve a decorated cake for everyone having a birthday in that month. We all sing happy birthday, and lit candles are blown out on the cake.

We also provide rides for some of our regulars. We have speakers about such topics as nutrition, healthy eating, exercise and general information pertaining to senior lifestyles and programs available to older people. Slides are also shown. Through Elder Services of Berkshire County, we also award the Boston Post gold-headed cane to the oldest senior citizen in town. The last award went to Jane Bayette at Ashmere Nursing Home, who was 96 years old at the time.

Our discretionary grant provides the town with an outreach person. Elders in need of information about services of any kind can call the Dalton Council on Aging of 684-2000.

Department of Public Works

This is a brief summary of Highway Department activities over the past year.

Last year, we replaced the two culverts at the Plunkett Lake causeway, one being six feet in diameter by sixty feet long, and the other three feet in diameter by sixty feet long. This needed to be done as the 6-foot culvert was attached to a stone arch under the road that was weak and deteriorating. We completed this project while the Plunkett Lake dam repairs were being done, as the water was down. Then, this spring, the entire length of Longview Avenue, from Camp Emerson to the Transfer Station, was re-surfaced.

Also during this year, culverts were replaced and shoulder work and brush cutting done, along with the resurfacing of Old Windsor Road and Frank Schnopp Road from the Dalton town line to George Schnopp Road. These projects were done with Chapter 90 funds, in combination with some of our summer maintenance funds.

Work continues to be done all over town on drainage and brush cuttings, as time allows. Patching pot holes and improving drainage continues, along with normal maintenance of all roads.

Also this year, we received our new truck, thanks to Town Meeting approval. The truck has already shown to be an added advantage to us. Thank you for your support.

Chapter 90 monies seem to be coming in a little better, so maybe a little more can be done. Hopefully they are going to be better than in the past.

Water department improvements continue, with work being done on our filtration plant and grant monies going towards the replacement of the South Street water line this coming year.

I would like to thank all who have contributed to the smooth operation of this department this past year.

Emergency Management Agency

This past year the Hinsdale Emergency Management Agency has been busy rounding out its capabilities for the Community. A four hundred gallon water tanker (water buffalo) was procured. Within two weeks of its acquisition, the tank was placed into service to provide water to the residents of Ashmere Heights. The Town of Blandford had a water main break and requested the utilization of the water trailer through "Mutual Aid." The trailer is also available should a resident's water well fail.

A seven hundred gallon a minute water pump was purchased through Massachusetts State Surplus in joint effort between the Fire Department, Highway Department and Emergency Management.

The Hinsdale Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan was up dated to reflect Community improvements.

We are currently working with Federal and State Governmental Agencies to refine and expand the Government Surplus Programs available to Communities.

The station and all other equipment are in good shape at this time. With a new pumper and our new water system, we hope to have the towns ISO Fire Insurance Rate lowered in the near future.
